WA Health is encouraging all staff in Western Australian schools to be vaccinated, to protect you and the community from COVID-19.

The highly contagious Delta strain of COVID-19 can have severe medical consequences for people of all ages. Getting vaccinated is a safe and effective way to help prevent you and others from getting seriously ill.

Additional opportunities for vaccination have been created for school staff in metropolitan and regional areas by offering walk-in opportunities at particular times at WA Health clinics. Students aged 16 years and over can also access these clinics.

No appointment is needed during these times; however it is recommended that you register an account on [VaccinateWA](#) to make it easier to check in. You will also need to show proof of employment, for example a payslip.

You can also book an appointment at a state-led clinic in regional and metropolitan WA by going online at [Roll up for WA](#) and clicking “book now”.

You may wish to go to your family doctor or pharmacist for your vaccination. Appointments can be booked in the usual way.

Providing these walk-in opportunities at vaccination clinics just for school-based staff and students aged 16 years and over is an important step in keeping our children learning and our community safe.
