



Introduction

Fox, any of various members of the dog family [Canidae] resembling small to medium sized bushy tailed dogs with long fur, pointed ears, and a narrow snout. In a restricted sense, the name refers to the 10 or so species classified as "true" foxes (genus Vulpes), especially the red or common, fox (V. Vulpes), which live in both the Old World. Several other foxes in genera other Vulpes, including the north America grey fox, five species of South America fox (including the blue fox), the bat eared fox, and the crab eating fox

How Foxes look like

 The fox has reddish-brown fur, a white chest and a bushy, whitetipped tail, called a brush. Its nose and ears are pointed. Foxes are widespread and quite common throughout Britain, and a surprising number live in towns. They are active at dusk and during the night, searching alone for food.





What Foxes eat

They have very varied diet, Urban foxes
eat earthworms, insects, fruit and
vegetables and a wide variety of both
domestic wild birds and mammals. Insects
include large numbers of beetles, cut
worms (the larvae of noctuid moths, which
they get off lawns on wet nights), and both
larval and adult craneflies.



What kills foxes and what does foxes protect

Poisoning, hunting, roadkill, disease, predation, food shortage and social factors contribute to mortality. Foxes in Australia have few natural predators, birds of prey and dogs in particular can kill foxes, particularly cubs. The red fox utilizes multiple defense mechanisms such as their sharp teeth, musky odor (which is comparable to a skunk's), small size (which allows it to hide or flee from larger predators), speed, and intelligence.
